

Jigawa State: Key Achievements (January – April 2025)

1. Service Delivery

- In Q1 2025, the capacity of 616
 healthcare workers was
 strengthened on Environmental
 and Social Safeguards (E&S),
 covering all 287 wards in the 27
 LGAs. These trainings emphasized
 proper healthcare waste
 management, waste segregation
 practices, and safe disposal
 methods, particularly in alignment
 with national E&S guidelines.
- To enhance hospital delivery rates and reduce under-five and maternal mortality, the IMPACT project supported the engagement and training of 2,870 Traditional Birth Attendants (TBAs) across the 287 political wards of the state. Through their active involvement, 13,209 pregnant women were referred for facilitybased deliveries, while 8,790 eligible children were referred for routine immunization services at the nearest health facilities.

Officers and Health Facility M&E personnel were trained on electronic Health Management Information System (DHIS2), data validation, management, analysis, and use for decision-making at the facility level, significantly improving data quality and service delivery accountability.

2. Primary Health Care (PHC) Strengthening

- With the support of the IMPACT
 Project, the state conducted 5,912
 routine immunization outreach
 sessions across 281 PHCs. As a result:
 - o 11,035 eligible children received the third dose of Pentavalent vaccine (Penta 3).
 - o 15,063 children were vaccinated with the first dose of the Measles Containing Vaccine (MCV1).
 - The project oriented 40 M&E and Program Officers from both state and LGA levels on how to conduct Integrated Supportive Supervision (ISS) and provide on-the-job mentorship to healthcare workers across 287 PHCs in Jigawa State.

- As part of maternal and child health interventions:
 - 3,000 Mama Kits were distributed to 281 APEX
 PHCs across all 27 LGAs.
 - 5,000 Immunization Packs were also delivered to the same PHCs to boost vaccination coverage and cold chain management.
- The capacity-building efforts on electronic HMIS, data quality, and analysis (as mentioned above) were pivotal in promoting a culture of evidence-based decision-making at the facility level.

Additionally, the IMPACT Project facilitated training for 40 M&E and Program Officers to lead quarterly Data Quality Assessments (DQAs) using the NHMIS PHC DQA/I national standard checklist. This has enhanced the integrity and reliability of facility-level data across the state.

3. PHC Revitalization

- Under One of Investment Support to BHCPF Facilities:
 - 114 Out of the 281 APEX PHCs earmarked for revitalization:
 - 35 PHCs (31%) have been fully completed.
 - 71 PHCs (62%) are nearing 95% completion.
 - 8 PHCs (7%) are at approximately 70% completion.
- The total contract value for the revitalization initiative is \(\frac{\pmathbf{9}}{9}\),778,830,388 (Nine billion, seven hundred seventy-eight million, eight hundred thirty thousand, three hundred eightyeight naira).

Compliance with the Environmental and Social Management Plan (ESMP)
has been prioritized throughout implementation, and no major issues
have been reported thus far. Routine site supervision and mitigation
compliance tracking are ongoing.

4. Local Government Health Authorities (LGHAs)

- Payment for LGA Performance Framework Activities was not implemented during Q1 2025. However, mechanisms are being developed to enable performance-based disbursements in future quarters to improve LGAlevel ownership and accountability.
- 5. The IMPACT Project continues to serve as a catalyst for health sector transformation in Jigawa State, driving sustainable improvements in primary healthcare delivery. Key catalytic contributions from January to April 2025 include:
 - **Digitization of 281 PHCs**, enabling real-time data entry, accurate reporting, and evidence-based decision-making at the facility level.
 - Capacity Building:
 - 308 healthcare workers trained in digital health tools, financial management, and facility-level accountability.
 - Over 500 healthcare workers trained on Environmental and Social Safeguards (E&S), promoting safe, inclusive, and climatesensitive healthcare service delivery.
 - Provision of 3,000 Mama Kits to 281 APEX PHCs, serving as a key demand-generation strategy to encourage pregnant women to deliver at health facilities, thereby contributing to reduced maternal and neonatal mortality.
 - **Solar Power Installation** in PHCs, ensuring uninterrupted service delivery—especially for cold chain management and nighttime maternal care.

- Engagement of 2,870 Traditional Birth Attendants (TBAs) across 287 wards, contributing to increased referrals of pregnant women and eligible children to health facilities for delivery and immunization services.
- **Improved Community Engagement** through health outreach sessions, town hall meetings, and distribution of IEC materials developed in local languages.
- Institutionalization of Integrated Data Quality Assessment and Improvement (IDQA/I) using the national standardized checklist (NHMIS DQA/I), improving confidence in health data accuracy and use.
- Strengthened Governance and Coordination through:
 - Support for PHC revitalization and infrastructure upgrades.
 - Enhanced transparency in Direct Facility Funding (DFF).
 - **Joint supportive supervision** involving SPHCDA, LGHA, and implementing partners to improve service quality and accountability.
